



In between the images...

Half of the seven weeks of Easter are behind us as I write this article. The lilies are gone but the butterflies on the walls and paraments remain. The "Alleluia" noisemakers are all put away for another year. Yet, we are still singing a lot of "Alleluia" songs. The in-between time – Easter parties and celebrations are behind us but it is not yet the Pentecost celebration.

Most churches have stopped special celebrations for Ascension Day (May 18 this year) because it falls on a Thursday and it is hard to get people out for worship on a Thursday. Yet the festival day in the church year still comes. This is the day we celebrate Jesus' ascension into heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father. This is the day we would hear the story from Luke 24:44-53 and Acts 1:1-11 when Jesus tells the disciples that he would no longer be with them but would send the Holy Spirit (Pentecost) to empower them to be the apostles (sent ones) and to go out to Judea, Samaria and to the ends of the earth to be witnesses to all that they have seen, heard, and learned while spending time with Jesus (before his crucifixion and after his resurrection). They have seen it all. Now they are to wait for the Holy Spirit to come upon them so that they might have the power to do as Jesus instructs.

They waited...as we wait...for the next *big* experience – the next celebration. We will celebrate Pentecost on Sunday, May 28 (you are invited to wear red 😊). That day we will hear that the Holy Spirit has come to all of us and given us the power to be the people of God we were born to be. In the midst of the in-between time we hold on to Jesus' promise when reminds the disciples that he is with them (and us) always "to the end of the age." We are called to celebrate that good news every Sunday, every day. It seems harder to maintain that excitement through the in-between times. Yet, every day we are given the power of the Holy Spirit to go out and be excited that we know the Good News! We know Jesus and we can tell other people just what we know. We, too, have seen, heard and witnessed the awesome power of God in Christ with us, in us and spurring us on.

Council Highlights

What happened at the last meeting?

Council members met at 4:30 on Thursday, April 13 in the Digerud Room. Here are some highlights of the meeting:

- The minutes of the March meeting were approved.
- Finance Report was approved.
 - Discussed which reports were most helpful to council members each month.
 - Stew notified council that the new bank account has been opened and contains all the reserved funds.
 - Stew noted that giving is behind for the month; cautious spending was recommended.
 - Unbudgeted gate repair and Wi-Fi upgrades increased spending in the general building fund and PG&E bills continue to increase.
- Pastor report was reviewed. It was noted that a FEMA Grant Application would be submitted on April 14 for security improvements.
- Council 's Retreat planned for Friday, March 31 and Saturday, April 1 was cancelled due to scheduling conflicts. We will revisit a time and date.
- Summer community events were discussed. It was decided that we would participate in the Religious Extravaganza at TAFB on August 11 and plan a fall festival (date tbd).
- Discussed Diane Metz' recommendation that we provided temporary housing in Turkey. Information will be published in the May newsletter to determine interest (see pg. 10).
- Christian Education Team scheduled an Adult Forum (April 23) for folks to connect with council members on current events.

- Approved the purchase of 2 changing tables (one for each bathroom in the Worship Center) with memorial funds. Estimated to be about \$600 total.
- Stew Irwin is working to modify the Sanctuary Lamp (eternal candle) to electric power. This will prevent folks from getting up on a ladder each week to change the wax candles.



Seminary update

For those of who may not know, I am in my second year at Fuller Theological Seminary where I am pursuing a master's in divinity. I am also a part of the Latino Cohort at Fuller, which means that I interact and learn alongside Latino/a students from all over Central, South and North America. As of right now, all my classes are in Spanish. They are largely focused on the Latino/a perspective and experience of ministry, as well as understanding the implications of a westernized religion, how westernized religion has impacted the Latino communities throughout the world and where we serve. We also are working to understand what it is that we are called to do when God calls us into these spaces where we are faced with poverty, racial and systemic issues and how we as the Church can respond. This Spring term, I am taking two classes: HT501 - El Entendimiento De Dios y Cristo En La Reflexion De La Iglesia (The Understanding of God and Christ in the Reflection of the Church) and PM514 - Iglesias Misionales/Liderazgo (Missional Churches/Leadership).





Opportunities for Social Justice Activities

Join us at the Table Offering of Letters, Time

Since *Bread for the World* launched their Farm Bill Campaign last December, there have been 500 commitments to hold an Offering of Letters by congregations across the nation. Follow the link to view the [2023 OL PowerPoint](#) that helps explain this year's Offering of Letters and a [video](#) presenting the PowerPoint.

Pam Lyons and I, along with members of Grace United, Vallejo and other Bay Area congregation members in his district, met in March with Congressman John Garamendi to discuss the upcoming Farm Bill's renewal. Bread for the World envisions a Farm Bill that would build healthy, equitable and sustainable food systems for all in the United States. Now it is time for St. Mark's to add letters of support from its members and friends.

The impact of the farm bill is significant. It not only affects the agriculture and food sectors; it also plays a huge role in ending food insecurity and hunger in the U.S. and saves the lives of millions abroad.

This year, Congress is working to renew farm bill programs such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and international food aid programs. Among the measures that should be included are

strengthening nutrition security in domestic and international programs; creating a more equitable SNAP program; and increasing food systems sustainability. In other words, it affects the St. Mark Food Pantry Ministry and the many clients this ministry serves.

We'd like you to tell your U.S. Senators and Representatives to support the reauthorization of the farm bill in order to build healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems. The farm bill is our nation's most important national food system legislation. It is critical to the work of ending hunger at home and abroad. The farm bill impacts each one of us. As Congress works to renew our food and farm programs through the farm bill, I urge you to support legislation that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.

Pam and I will provide a sample letter, but it best to rewrite/retype and add your personalized touch. Specifically, I ask you to include some of the following requests:

- Increase access to fresh fruits and vegetables by increasing support for produce-specific Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program (GusNIP). This provides resources on top of monthly SNAP benefits for the purchase of fresh fruits and vegetables, primarily at farmers' markets, for a limited number of households.

- Eliminate barriers to SNAP for marginalized populations, including ending the ban on former drug offenders, eliminating work requirements for college students, and permitting indigenous communities to administer SNAP and other federal nutrition programs on reservations.
- Keep food out of landfills by increasing support for post-harvest food recovery efforts and addressing the threat to food security posed by extreme weather.
- Support funding for international food aid programs such as Food for Peace.

Conclude with something such as “As a person of faith, I am moved to help and advocate for people experiencing hunger and poverty - no matter where they live. This is why I urge you to support a farm bill that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.” Join us after the May 21st Worship Service to write a letter OR you may also write to our representatives on your own. Pam and I would appreciate knowing if you write for our report to Bread for the World on what St. Mark Lutheran Church has contributed to the Offering of Letters.

Our Congregation Can Provide Housing for a family in Türkiye

Is our congregation looking for a tangible way to make a difference for a family in Türkiye?

The LWR team is working with local partners to build a prefabricated container housing community in Kirikhan, a district in Türkiye extremely hard hit by the quakes. The community will consist of containers that will be able to house up to six people and include two rooms, a bathroom with a shower and toilet, a cooking area with a small sink, and a small garden plot.
