



"We are one in the spirit
We are one in the Lord...
And we pray that all unity will one day
be restored"

What is it? And why are we celebrating?

The words of this old favorite hymn, "They'll Know We are Christians by our Love" is the reason we talk about, share stories, and experiences of Juneteenth.

"Juneteenth is a holiday that commemorates the end of slavery in the United States. It recalls how the states of Louisiana and Texas heard the news that President Abraham Lincoln had signed the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863. Slavery continued in those two states for more than two years after the proclamation was signed because the word had yet to travel there. Texas and Louisiana finally got the good news on June 19, 1865. Former slaves broke out in spontaneous celebration. These were dangerous times. Even in the face of resistance and threat, the formerly enslaved Africans found ways to give voice to the wide range of thoughts and emotions at the announcement of the end of legalized slavery in the United States of America." (ELCA Resource for Worship 2019)

In response to our continuing look at history and its effects on God's people and our country today, the ELCA created worship resources and a study guide for its predominately white members to help us all learn more about the effects of slavery on our sisters and brothers of color and on our whole country. A few members of St. Mark's engaged in that study during April and May. The title of this study is "Now Is the Time." "Now is the time for white members of the ELCA to face their own resistance and fear. Now is the time to name uncomfortable truths. Now is the time to let go of guilt and embrace responsibility. Now is the time to uncover silence and complicity. Now is the time to acknowledge the depths of systemic racism and white supremacist culture and thinking. Now is the time to recognize how our lives and history are interwoven and how white lives also cry out for liberation from the demeaning impact of racism. Now is the time for repentance, and the time to trust God's liberating grace, which gives us courage to face an uncomfortable past and walk boldly into a new future of racial justice and reconciliation, and of structural change." (Now is the Time, ELCA 2019)

The group was left with questions like "so, what do we do?" One of the things we can do is to continue to educate ourselves. Our worship service on Sunday, June 19 will include rituals and prayers from the African American tradition that help us to learn more through a slightly different experience of worship. This is not an attempt to appropriate the traditions and culture of our brothers and sisters of color, but a tool to continue

educating ourselves and listening to the stories of others. It is only when we listen to each other's stories that we can truly "walk with each other" "hand in hand" to "spread the news that God is in our land."

We encourage everyone to consider a special offering on that day to Hidden Genius Project – Richmond, Oakland, CA (<https://www.hiddengeniusproject.org/>) or a not-for-profit of your choice that supports and uplifts our brothers and sisters of color.

We can also support the Fairfield CAN's (Clergy Action Network) first annual Juneteenth celebration on Saturday, June 18. Churches from across Fairfield – all denominations, all cultures, and all ethnicities – will come together to celebrate freedom from slavery. Come join us!

Council Highlights

The council met on Thursday, May 12 at 6:15 p.m. in the Digerud Room.

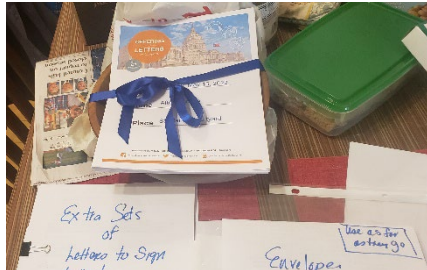
- After opening with prayer, we welcomed Sharon Hermosillo Magaña, our Youth and Children's Ministry Director. Sharon requested permission to raise funds to provide Vacation Bible Camp scholarships children from the neighborhood. Council voted to approve raising up to \$1,200 for scholarship.
- Minutes were approved.
- We did not have a financial report due to a computer problem.
- Council members discussed a meeting with our Finance Team to get a clearer understanding of our various processes.
- The ACTS for Vitality leadership survey was discussed; members requested additional information before making a decision.
- Council voted to contribute \$500 from Congregational Life funds to the Fairfield CAN (Clergy Action Network)'s First Annual Juneteenth celebration on June 18. The funds will be used to sponsor a food truck for the event.
- Council voted to suggest a special offering on Sunday, June 19 to Hidden Genius Project (or another organization of the donor's choosing) that supports African American people.
- Council voted to submit an ad to the Daily Republic for their July magazine "How to." The advertising budget will cover the cost of \$350 for this one-time opportunity.
- Proposed updates to the Constitution and Bylaws we put on hold until further review of the documents.
- Council voted to hire Patricia Jones as a Preschool Teacher in support of the Preschool Board's recommendation. It was also noted the Ms. Barbara, a long-time teach will retire at the end of May.
- Songs & Suds plans are moving along. Information will go out in the June newsletter and by special emails.

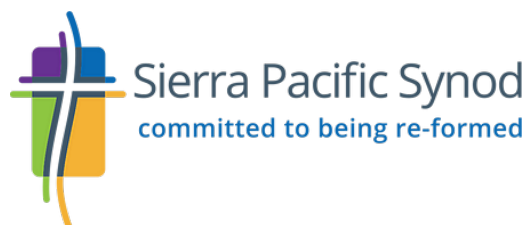

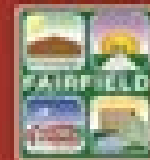
