






Council met on Thursday, November 6, 2025 at 11:30 a.m. in Pastor Karen's office. Here are some highlights from that meeting.

- Minutes were approved without change.
- Financial Secretary reported that our non-pledged offerings are significantly lower than last year at this time.
 General Fund balance was less than \$2,000. Council voted to transfer \$10,000 from Building and Capital Assets Reserve Fund to the General Fund. Hopefully, November and December will make up the deficit.
- Pastor asked for a volunteer to wrap the CAN dinner utensils in napkins before the event. June has a couple of people looking for volunteer hours. She will ask them to take care of it.
- We agreed to set up the Youth Director's telephone message as a Food Pantry Information so people calling in can just push the extension and get the information.
- The Annual Meeting was set for Sunday, January 25, 2026.
- We discussed audio versions of the Monthly Newsletter and Weekly

- Updates. We have asked the Social Media Chairs to think about how this would work (what platform to use, etc.)
- Outreach Team's reported a letter writing campaign for World Hunger.
- Food Pantry reported the numbers of people coming for food each week is increasing.
- Voted to recommend additional Constitution/Bylaw/Continuing Resolution changes to the congregation at the January, 25, 2026 Annual Meeting. The proposed changes will be linked to the email with this newsletter.
- Agreed to email the updates to Chapters 1, 3, and 4, of the Operations Manual, a chart of changes to Chapter 5 Personnel Policies and a full electronic copy of the Chapter 5 Personnel Policies to members in December. (Note: Chapter 2 Constitution and Bylaws will be updated after above changes are voted on. Chapter 6 is currently being updated by Preschool Board; Chapter 7 Youth Ministry will be updated when needed.)

Our next meeting is Thursday, December 11 at 11:30 a.m. in Pastor's Office.

Stewards of God's Love are empowered by Grace

Making a financial pledge to the congregation might be likened to a road trip. In fact, taking such a trip last month reminded me of that similarity. In mid-November, the solar storms were brewing. Pastor Karen, June Johnsen, and their friends were leaving for Alaska to see the gorgeous Northern Lights. On the spur of that particular moment, we decided to see them too. We set out, not knowing where exactly where we'd end up. [I think making a financial pledge seems like that too at times; we say, we'll give a certain amount to support the congregation but we're not certain of our financial situation because we think, what if?\.

We ended up in Winnemucca, Nevada and did not see the Northern Lights along the way. But we found a lithium mining operation had turned the town upside down in terms of available lodging. We visited ten hotels before the *Inn at Winners Casino* finally said yes—"there's lodging for two plus a dog!"

Certainly, we felt much like Mary and Joseph setting out into the unknown, and not finding lodging. In the morning, we realized that the environment was not unlike the area they'd traveled too. But we had been guarded and guided by God as we traveled.

We also realized we were only 4 hours away from our son's home, so after some very positive intereactions with folks in Winnemucca, we headed to Boise area. These pleasant interactions were, in my view, God's grace, giving us energy to set out on a new direction with a new goal, just like when challenges come about with pledged giving. We ended up seeing, hugging and being



guided by Kris and Dawn over the next few days. We were anxious about getting home because of the recent storms, but with support

(God and family), we made the trek to the summit (sunny there) and home safely, though not without a few challenges, especially fog!

Fog is something that prevents clear vision and again, the pledges we make seem like that at times. But with God's grace, we set forward on the prescribed route and safely reached the goal of being in our home again just like one makes a financial goal and trusts God's grace and love will protect and help them reach their goal. In the process, confidence grows.

As I write this article (11/23/25), thirty-eight pledges have been received providing \$240,000 towards the St. Mark's Lutheran Church congregation's 2026 budget for the congregation. The congregation is immensely grateful for your projected support in 2026. Thank you!

In 2024, we had 40 pledges totalling \$261,000. Thus, we have \$20,000 less projected income than last year. Last year, commitments grew by 7.5%; this year they have diminished but we have 5 more weeks of the year, and Advent is a season of Hope! I pray that other pledges will come forth as we await Christ's birth once again.

Remember, that your pledge can be adjusted at any time as life circustances

arise. Remember, too, that If you have not yet made a financial pledge, there is not minimum requirement. If you can pledge \$10 (or less) per month in 2026 and faithfully fulfill that pledge, it is God's grace that empowered you to make that commitment and to grow in your giving. Pledges are always confidential and can be made by putting a pledge card in the offering plate or entering your pledge online. If you have questions, talk to Financial Secretary, Linda Frogget or Financial Officer, Stew Irwin.

Go now as stewards of God's abundance; remembering the many ways that God has come to you; celebrate all that God has entrusted to your care; and do justice for the sake of the neighbor both near and far. As stewards of God's love, each of us is empowered by grace!






