See it anew

Many members and guests sit in our pews marveling at the amazing stained glass window behind the altar. Did you know it is called "The Spirit of Life" and that it was commissioned especially for St. Mark's in 2002?

Many folks who have been with us for a long time may know or remember the story. For many others, here goes:

This work of art measures approximately 10 feet by 30 feet. This window is made of mouthblown glasses and tiffany reproduction glasses, including special drapery glasses. The design includes an angel of the Lord at the top right announcing the risen Christ, symbolized by an empty crystal cross. The tree of life that ascends up the left side of the window, upon further meditation, reveals a descending dove. The cobalt blues are symbolic of the New Creation we have in Christ. There is a crown of thorns at the base of the cross, sprinkled with waters of baptism. The symbol of wheat representing Holy Communion, springs to life through the waters of baptism that have fix red faceted jewels, the jewels themselves a symbol of Christ's five wound and precious blood. The rocks below are symbol of our foundation in Christ. Even the leaves of the tree transition

into crystal, a reflection of our new life in Christ. The magentas and lavenders call us to the passion of Christ.

The artists, the Hogan family, began in Dublin, Ireland adorning Europe's churches and cathedrals. Roger and Cynthia Hogen reside in Norther California with their family of 5 children. They continue this tradition as they pass their talent to their children.

Sometimes we need to here the stories again to look at things in a new way. Next month, find out more about the images on the rotating base of the altar!



Stewardship of Praise

As the Stewardship Ministry Team continues the theme *Stewards of God's Love* this year, this month let's consider ways that **praise** can be used in our daily lives and the effect it has.

During the midweek, midday Lenten Devotions in April, the group attending ate lunch together and then read the devotional lessons from Life Renewed. The passages we read from the week of March 30th were from Ezekial 37 about the valley of dry bones. We talked about native North American children and others whose lives were cut short. We read on in Ezekial and heard that God made the dry bones come alive and that the prophet was using this vision to show how when a people have no hope, life can come again. But in reflecting about these passages, the group felt a sense of doom and death. Finally, as we finished the week's readings, we came to Zephaniah 3: verses 17-18, "The Lord is in your midst; he will rejoice over you with gladness, he will renew you with his love; he will exult over you with loud singing as on a day of festival". Though we were just reading and discussing these passages, the heaviness of the Ezekial passages was visibly lifted by the joyful verse that rounded out the week. As stewards of God's Love, we can be more cognizant praising others instead of being critical or always seeing problems rather than seeing the positive. We can all **praise** a little more! I know that group members attending that day felt a call to share gratitude more often--to be more understanding and little less demanding. Try it yourself!


