





SMLC has been using the New Revised Standard Version of the bible for a number of years. So why a new edition? "The purpose of this updating was to make use of the current scholarly consensus concerning the best Hebrew and Greek manuscripts and to register recent changes in the English language." Sunday Connections Speaker November 5, 2023




St. Mark's is pleased to welcome Jerry Metzker from Lutheran Social Services of Northern California as the guest speaker at our Adult Forum on November 5, 2023. With a history dating back to 1884, Lutheran Social Services

(LSS) serves the most vulnerable throughout Northern California, providing housing and supportive services to those experiencing or at risk of homelessness. Lutheran Social Services is a partner of the Sierra-Pacific Synod. LSS follows a housing first method that ensures that those we serve get a safe and secure place to lay their heads every night and then provides the support and guidance the transition age youth, seniors and other adults need to achieve their highest level of stability. All donations make a difference in lives and the community. LSS serves 4,200 people via 40 different programs and initiatives in nine counties, including Solano County.

Jerry Metzker joined Lutheran Social Services as Development Director two years ago, where he oversees the organization's fundraising, communications and community relations, including parish relations. Jerry is a cradle Lutheran, born in Ohio, attended Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio and moved to the Bay Area from New York City. He has worked in development for more than 25 years. In the past weeks we have borne witness to the horrors of the escalating crisis between Israel, Hamas,


