

Council met on Thursday, September 11, 2025. The full minutes will be available once they have been approved at the October 2025 meeting.

- The minutes from the August meeting were approved.
- Finance Report

- Offerings for August were \$11,000 behind expected. We are waiting and watching to see what happens in September and October.
- Updated us on Fundraising efforts (as of 9/11/25) for Security (need \$1,100); IT (need \$3,600); Social Media (this was a budgeted item and expenses are still well within the budgeted amount).
- The Ops Manual for Financial Policies is being reviewed and changes will be brought to Council in October.
- Proposed change to Constitution, Bylaws & Continuing Resolutions will be brought to Council in October.
- Pastor reported needing absolute commitments from volunteers for the CAN Thanksgiving dinner within the next week. A sign-up will be in the narthex on Sunday.
- Personnel Committee reported that they will bring proposed updates to Council in October.
- Preschool requested that we share the cost of floor waxing (Preschool building); Council voted to contribute \$500 by reducing the Preschool invoice.
- President June Johnsen will activate the Nominating Committee (Dennis Digman, Ann Hefner-Gravink, Janelle Jolley, Pamela Lyons, Stu Reid and Colleen Rivers) in the next week.
- God's Work. Our Hands. event was a great success. We are encouraging members to consider planning another.

- There will be a \$20/month increase in our IT Support due to an increase cost to the vendor.
- Voted to re-establish a Sabbatical Reserve Fund. It will be a line item to receive donations if someone chooses. It will not be a budget line item.

## Installation of the **Presiding Bishop**



Saturday, October 4, 2025 I 2:00 p.m. CDT Central Lutheran Church I Minneapolis, Minn.

(Evangelical Lutheran Church in America)



The Rev. Yehiel Curry was elected as the next presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, Ariz., on July 30, 2025. He will begin this role on Oct. 1, 2025, and be installed on October 4 in Minneapolis.

Currently, he serves as bishop of the ELCA Metropolitan Chicago Synod, where he leads a synod staff and 160 congregations by providing pastoral care, preaching, teaching, administering sacraments, and overseeing ordinations and installations.

He was elected synod bishop in 2019 and reelected in spring 2025. Curry chaired the ELCA Conference of Bishops, fostering ecumenical relationships and theological engagement across the Lutheran communion.

Previously, Curry served as the mission

developer (2007–2012) and pastor (2013–2019) of Shekinah Chapel Lutheran Church in Riverdale, IL. He earned a Bachelor of Arts from Lewis University in Romeoville, IL, and a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. He and his wife, LaShonda, are the proud parents of three daughters.

The presiding bishop installation is open to the public, and tickets are not required. Doors open at 1:00 p.m. Central time, and worship begins at 2:00 p.m.

### Ending at the beginning



September 17, 2025
"I started my ministry as presiding bishop with these four emphases: We are church. We are Lutheran. We are church together. We are church for the sake of the world. I will end as I began."

In her final Living Lutheran column as presiding bishop, Elizabeth Eaton reflects on the core values that have shaped her leadership. She reminds us that the heart of the church is the gospel — and that God's work through the ELCA is far from over.
